Attention Foreign Exhibitors

Event Registration Number (ERN) Notice

All dogs that are foreign born and owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an ERN. An ERN must be obtained within 30 days of obtaining points, awards or scores to avoid cancellation. If factors beyond your control prohibit this or present a problem, please send a written request for a 30 day extension to the CKC. The first place dog from each class will be brought together to compete for Best in Sweepstakes and Runner up in Sweepstakes. Classes (divided by sex) will be as follows:

6-9 months Male/Female 9-12 month Male/Female
12-15 month Male/Female 15-18 month Male/Female

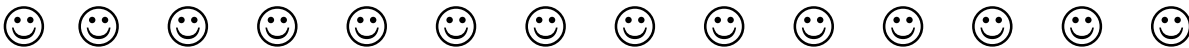

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION #1. A dog awarded WINNERS at a Championship show held under these Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5), and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as provided hereunder. SECTION #2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows;

DOGS COMPETING*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
POINTS AWARDED	0	1	2	3	4	5

*includes the dog awarded Winners

To determine the number of points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all dogs in competition which were defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed Championship show will be credited with 5 points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified or that is dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge, shall be included in the calculation for championship points (Absentees are not to be included). In order for a dog to be recognized as a Canadian Champion it must: (1) earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; (2) a two point win awarded either at the breed or group level; and (3) be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN)

The following classes will be offered at BOTH Specialties:

REGULAR CONFORMATION CLASSES (divided by sex):

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 TO 15 MONTHS - Shall be for dogs 12 months of age and under 15 months of age on the day of the Specialty.

15 TO 18 MONTHS - Shall be for dogs 15 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the Specialty

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. (Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring owner/breeder. The handler MUST be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS (Fawn) - This class shall be for all dogs

OPEN CLASS (Brindle) - This class shall be for all dogs

VETERANS CLASS: Shall be for all dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the Specialty. The winners of the Veteran Male and Female classes will NOT compete for Championship points but goes directly into the Best of Breed competition. SPAYED OR NEUTERED DOGS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR COMPETITION IN THIS CLASS

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog which has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog MAY be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class MUST be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED. Listing Fees WILL NOT be refunded

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class MAY NOT COMPETE in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY

ALTERED CLASSES:

Shall be limited to dogs over six months of age which have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure. Points MAY NOT be carried from the regular competition judging to the Altered class judging. This class will be judged upon completion of Best of Breed.

Two classes only will be offered as follows: Altered Male and Altered Female

Classes will be placed first through fourth in both sexes, the first place winners from each class will be declared Winners and the second place winner from each class will be awarded Reserve. The Altered Winners Male and Altered Winners Female will then compete for Best Altered in Breed & Best Opposite Altered.

NON-REGULAR CONFORMATION CLASSES:

Note: Any dog entered in a Non-Regular class MUST also be entered in a regular class or for Exhibition Only.

STUD DOG & GET: This class shall be comprised of the stud dog and 2 or more of his get. Ownership in this class need not be identical. Stud must be entered in a Regular class or in Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular Class. Dogs entered in the Stud Dog and Get class may be spayed/neutered, and must be entered in a Regular class as outlined in these rules or for Exhibition Only.

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY: This class shall have the same requirements as the Stud Dog and Get class. Dogs entered in the Brood Bitch and Progeny class may be spayed/neutered, and must be entered in a Regular class as outlined in these rules or for Exhibition Only.

BRACE CLASS: Shall be for two dogs (not necessarily the same sex), (Note: effective January 1, 2006 – identical ownership NO LONGER applies)

* * * * *

OFFICIAL OBEDIENCE CLASSES:

NO dog may be entered in both NOVICE “A” & NOVICE “B” @ THE SAME TRIAL.

NO dog may be entered in both OPEN “A” & OPEN “B” @ THE SAME TRIAL

NOVICE “A” - This class is open to all dogs, providing the dog has not earned the title of “CD” in ANY COUNTRY. One dog ONLY may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. The exhibitor MUST BE THE OWNER or A MEMBER OF HIS/HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY and MUST SHOW THE DOG IN ALL EXERCISES. No licensed handler, trainer or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its “UD” title in Canada or Elsewhere shall be allowed to compete in this class, but MUST COMPETE IN NOVICE “B” CLASS

NOVICE “B” - This class is open to all dogs, which have not earned the title of “CD”, and may be shown by the owner or any other person. The dog may not necessarily be CKC or ERN Reg’d to compete in this class

OPEN “A” - This class is open to all dogs which have earned the title of “CD” IN CANADA, but have not earned the title of “CDX” in any country. One dog ONLY may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. The exhibitor MUST BE THE OWNER or A MEMBER OF HIS/HER

IMMEDIATE FAMILY and MUST SHOW THE DOG IN ALL EXERCISES. No licensed handler, trainer or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its "UD" title in Canada or Elsewhere shall be allowed to compete, but MUST COMPETE IN THE OPEN "B" CLASS. A CKC or ERN Reg'd number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class

OPEN "B" - This class is open to all dogs, which have earned the title of "CD" in CANADA, and may be shown by the owner or any other person. This dog MAY ALSO COMPETE IN THE UTILITY CLASS. A CKC or ERN Reg'd number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class

UTILITY CLASS - This class is open to all dogs, which have earned the title of "CDX" in CANADA. This dog may be shown by the owner or any other person. A CKC or ERN Reg'd number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class

UNOFFICIAL OBEDIENCE CLASSES:

All dogs entered the Unofficial Class must also be entered in one of the Official Classes or for exhibition only on the same day.

BRACE CLASS -This class is open to any two dogs of the breed and of either sex, which have attained not less than a "CD" title in Canada. Same person need not own both dogs.

TEAM CLASS – this class is open to any 4 dogs of any breed and of either sex which have attained not less than a C.D. title in Canada. It is not necessary that the same person own all dogs in the team or that they be of the same breed, except when entered in a breed specialty obedience trial. Five dogs may be entered, one to be considered as an alternate. However, the same 4 dogs must compete in all exercises.

VETERANS CLASS- This class shall be for all dogs that have an obedience title and are 7 years old prior to the closing of entries. The exercises shall be performed and judged as in the "Novice Class". Dogs entered in the Veterans Class may also be entered in any Regular class or for Exhibition Only.

TRANSITION OBEDIENCE CLASSES:

PRE-NOVICE – This class shall be for all purebred dogs and those breeds as designated on the list of miscellaneous breeds and of either sex, which have not earned the title of P.C.D. (Pre-Companion Dog) in Canada. Dogs being entered in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class and must have an additional handler for each dog when they are judged together on the Group exercise. A dog may be entered in the Pre-Novice that has not earned the title of C.D. in Canada or a comparable title in any other country. The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to the Novice Classes.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE – This class shall be for purebred dogs of any breed and those breeds as designated on the list of miscellaneous class breeds and of either sex that have earned the title of (C.D.) Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog and any other advanced obedience title in Canada. A dog eligible for entry in the Open A or B Class at any obedience trial held under these rules is also eligible for entry in the Novice C and Novice Intermediate Class at the same trial. The Novice Intermediate class (C.D.I.) is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to a Companion Dog Excellent title. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs are eligible to compete in this class indefinitely. Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

NOVICE "C" – This class is open to any dog of either sex that has gained the title Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog or any other advanced Obedience title in Canada prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Exhibitors may enter more than one dog in this class but must have a separate handler for each dog in the Long Sit and the Long Down Exercises

when they are judged in the same group. The Novice 'C' exercises will be performed and judged as described in the official Novice Class except that exhibitors may compete in the Novice 'C' Class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs entered in the Novice 'C' Class are not eligible for High In Trial. The P.C.D. and C.D.I. and Novice 'C' are elective classes which are offered for those people who feel the dog requires ring experience and acclimation to the trial situation or would like to earn additional titles. Dogs may be entered in the Novice – Intermediate (C.D.I.) and/or Novice 'C' class in addition to any of the Official Classes or Unofficial Classes.

EXTRACTS FROM CKC DOG SHOW RULES

CHAPTER 4.1.3 - JUDGES

A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to any indignities of any kind during the progress of the show, and it shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see this rule is effectively enforced.

8 - ENTRIES and ENTRY FEES

Section 3.1

Every dog entered in Championship Shows held under these rules must be registered, have an Event Registration Number, eligible for registration with the CKC or have a CKC Miscellaneous Class Certification number issued by the CKC Chief Registrar. If a dog is not registered individually in the CKC it may be entered at a show, held under these rules, as a "listed" dog, provided

(a) it is not a Miscellaneous breed

(b) if born in Canada, is eligible for individual registration

(c) if foreign born and owned, an Event Registration Number or CKC registration number is obtained from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.

A listing fee of \$8.48 must accompany the entry of a "listed" dog at a show held under these rules.

Section 2.3:

INCOMPLETE ENTRIES

Entry forms which are incomplete or those that contain incorrect information after the closing date of entries will be void and under no circumstances can changes be made. Any dog taking a win resulting from such an entry will result in the wins being canceled, and persons making such changes will be subject to disciplinary action.

Section 8.2:

DISHONORED CHEQUES

Tendering of a dishonored cheque or credit card in payment of entry fees shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is an offense punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. Clubs may refuse to accept entries from any exhibitors who have been known to tender dishonored cheques in payment of entry fees unless such entries are accompanied by a money order or certified cheque.

CHAPTER 14 - DISQUALIFICATION

Section 1.4

A dog once disqualified for any reason at a Championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown or entered at a show held under these rules unless and until said dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by a dog shown in violation of this section will be canceled by the CKC and the owner of said dog is subject to disciplinary action. Note: for any further information on reinstatement refer to Chapter 16, Section 3 of the CKC Dog Show Rules

CHAPTER 9 - EXHIBITORS and THEIR DOGS

A show-giving club will be held responsible during the show for the conduct of exhibitors and spectators. Any person acting in an abusive or objectionable manner must be removed from the show on complaint to the Show Superintendent.

8.2.5 – An error in the class, date of birth or sex of the dog may be amended on the entry form up to ONE hour PRIOR to the start of the show.

8.9.3 – When one or more all-breed and/or Specialty shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the request for moving class dogs to specials MUST be made a minimum of one hour prior to the scheduled start of the allbreed or Specialty show.

EXTRACTS FROM CKC CONFORMATION SHOW RULES

CHAPTER 4.1.3 - JUDGES

A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to any

indignities of any kind during the progress of the show, and it shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see this rule is effectively enforced.

8 - ENTRIES and ENTRY FEES

Section 3.1

Every dog entered in Championship Shows held under these rules must be registered, have an Event Registration Number, eligible for registration with the CKC or have a CKC Miscellaneous Class Certification number issued by the CKC Chief Registrar. If a dog is not registered individually in the CKC it may be entered at a show, held under these rules, as a "listed" dog, provided

(a) it is not a Miscellaneous breed

(b) if born in Canada, is eligible for individual registration

(c) if foreign born and owned, an Event Registration Number or CKC registration number is obtained from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.

A listing fee of \$8.50 must accompany the entry of a "listed" dog at a show held under these rules.

Section 2.3:
